TOWNSHIP OF WAYNE  
COUNTY OF PASSAIC  
STATE OF NEW JERSEY**

**CAPITAL ORDINANCE PROVIDING FUNDS BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS AVAILABLE IN THE SEWER CAPITAL FUND - RESERVE FOR EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT - TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE REPLACEMENT OF TWO BOILER HEATING SYSTEMS AT THE MOUNTAIN VIEW WASTEWATER TREATMENT SITE, AS DESCRIBED HEREIN**

**WHEREAS**, the sum of \$100,000.00 is presently available in the Sewer Capital Fund Reserve for Equipment Replacement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has determined that such sum should be appropriated for the replacement of two boiler heating systems at the Mountain View Wastewater Treatment Site; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the opinion of the Municipal Council that it is in the best interests of the Township of Wayne to utilize the said sum of \$100,000.00 in the Sewer Capital Fund Reserve for Equipment Replacement for the replacement of two boiler hearing systems at the Mountain View Wastewater Treatment Site.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Municipal Council of the Township of Wayne in the County of Passaic, State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The sum of \$100,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Sewer Capital Fund Reserve for Equipment Replacement for the replacement of two boiler hearing systems at the Mountain View Wastewater Treatment Site.

**SECTION 2.** The capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistencies herewith.

**SECTION 3.** If any section, sub-section, paragraph, sentence or any other part of this ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance.

**SECTION 4.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 5.** This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

**STATEMENT**

The Capital Ordinance published herewith has been finally adopted on **March 3, 2010** and the twenty-day period of limitation within which a suit, action, or proceeding questioning the validity of such ordinance can be commenced, as provided in the Local Bond Law, has begun to run from the date of the first publication of this statement.
